CONTEXT AND OVERALL OBJECTIVES

The project aims to increase the participation of lawyers, notaries and bailiffs in trainings on EU procedural civil and commercial law. This will be achieved through the organisation of transnational training activities with easy linguistic access and the training of trainers who will act as multipliers. The diverse group of Member States comprising the consortium (Cyprus, Estonia, Greece, Latvia, Poland) will promote the exchange of knowledge and good practice. The proposed action is supported by 16 professional associations and competent institutions for all target groups in he participating countries.





MAIN ACHIEVEMENTS

- building the capacity of 120 lawyers, notaries and bailiffs who have not participated in cross-border trainings on EU law due to language and other barriers;
- creating multipliers through the training of 15 trainers;
- rendering up to date training material available in 4 additional EU languages;
- creating cross-border networks and communities of practice transcending national and professional boundaries.

COVID-19 IMPACT ON THE PROJECT

RESEARCH

Desk and primary research were performed to fill in the gaps in our knowledge regarding the target groups' training needs. The desk research looked into the data available at the national and EU level regarding the training provided to the target groups on the topics addressed in the project, as well as participation rates and any qualitative indicators available, it revealed a shortage of relevant data and significant disparities among the participating countries. Its findings were supplemented by primary research (15 focus groups, 3/MS) aimed at assessing the target groups' knowledge and gain first hand input on their training needs.

TRAINING NEEDS ASSESSMENT

The research performed was integrated into five national TNA reports, which, in turn were consolidated into one aggregate TNA report, drafted by the WP leader, Tallinn University. The consolidated TNA report offers observations related to each individual MS as well as conclusions on common training needs and recommendations on suitable training approaches.

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

INITIAL & CONTINUOUS TRANSNATIONAL TRAINING

Four 2-day transnational trainings have been organised for professionals from all target groups. The workshops capitalised on the different backgrounds both national and professional of the participants and promoted the exchange of knowledge and good practices. To this aim, they have been divided into two main parts. In the first day, participants worked in group sessions, divided by target group (3 groups in total). They received training on the applicable EU law, standards and procedures and tested their knowledge through case studies and experiential exercises. In the second day of the training all groups worked together in a plenary session, where they discussed case studies tackling the issues from the perspectives of all target groups. At the end of the workshop, participants, with the assistance of the trainers, compiled checklists of useful practices for each procedure addressed, which will serve as a practical guide. The whole process facilitated by simultaneous interpretation and the presence of interpreters. Interpretation was available in Estonian, Greek, Latvian and Polish.

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
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PROGRESS ACHIEVED

NATIONAL & EU AWARENESS EVENTS

Following the conclusion of the trainings, 5 national awareness events are organized (1 in each participating country). Representatives of the target groups' professional associations, national training bodies, and members of the target groups, including participants in the trainings implemented in WP3, are invited to participate (30 participants per event). The purpose of these events was to communicate the project's results and outputs to those who stand to directly benefit from them, to raise awareness on the importance of the relevant EU procedures, and to inform participants on how to access the training material. The project's results are also presented at the EU level at a conference for 20 participants, including members of the target groups, representatives the ERA, UIHI, CNUE and other

policy makers
